
New electricity prices for households and small businesses start May 1, 2015

8.0 ¢ / kilowatt hour (kWh) Off-Peak

Mid-Peak 12.2¢/kWh 16.1¢/kWh On-Peak

These are the prices that appear on the electricity line of your bill and are only for the electricity you use. They do not include other charges like delivery.

Summer (May 1-Oct 31) time-of-use hours



Households that aren't yet on time-of-use pricing will pay 9.4¢/kWh for the first 600 kWh of electricity they use per month and 11.0¢ for each additional kWh. Small businesses will pay 9.4¢/kWh for the first 750 kWh of electricity they use per month and 11.0¢ for each additional kWh.

If you signed an electricity contract with a company, you pay the price agreed upon in the contract, not the price set by the OEB. For more about contracts visit our website.
